

SCHOOL BOARD/CITY COUNCIL RETREAT
AUGUST 22, 2007

Members of the Plano ISD School Board and City of Plano City Council held a joint retreat on Wednesday, August 22, 2007, at the Plano Station, 1012 E. 16th Street, Suite #105, Plano, Texas. School Board members attending were Duncan Webb , Mary Beth King, Melody Timinsky, Skip Jenkins, Missy Bender, John Muns, and Brad Shanklin. Staff members included Superintendent Doug Otto, Jeff Bailey, Richard Matkin, Karla Oliver, Jim Hirsch and Becky Taylor.

Following a continental breakfast, the retreat was called to order at 8:20 a.m. with Mayor Pat Evans presiding.

Greg Rushin, Plano Chief of Police, presented a report on the gun range program, highlighting the history of the program, qualifying requirements of the officers, plans for the construction of a new range adjacent to the current one, hours of operation and safety features.

Nancy Nevil, director of sustainability and environmental services, shared accomplishments of the past year following the creation of the "Green/LEEDS" program. Chip Gray, training manager for Plano ISD, followed with an overview of the district's "green" efforts.

David Stephens, director of technology services for the City, provided a status report on the public WiFi project and mesh network for city service personnel.

Bruce Glasscock from the City of Plano and Karla Oliver from Plano ISD presented information on each entity's plan in updating their strategic plan.

PISD Superintendent Doug Otto and City Manager Tom Muehlenbeck shared each entity's plans for upcoming bond programs. PISD's expected election would be in May, 2008 with the City's election in May, 2009.

During a discussion on joint capital projects, a suggestion was made to work collaboratively on each entity's projects and identify ways to partner on community and neighborhood needs.

With no further discussion, the meeting was adjourned at 10:40 a.m.
